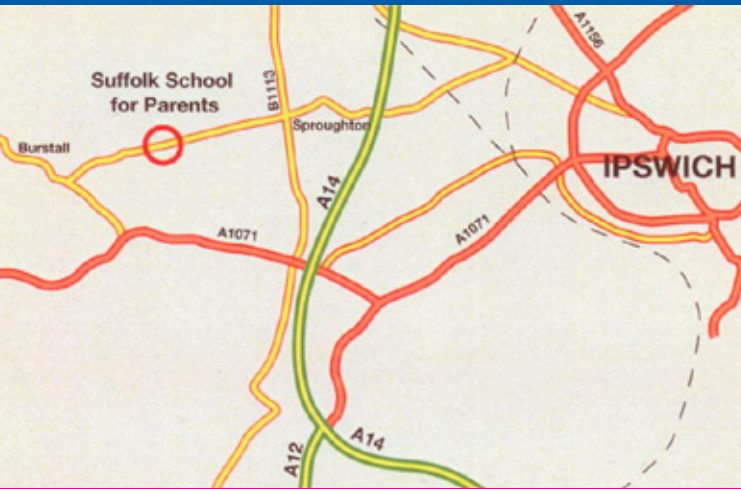


## Directions:

Exit the A14 at Junction 54. At the roundabout, take the third exit, follow signpost to Sproughton. At crossroads turn left, then immediately right, up beside the Wild Man Public House (this is Burstall Lane). Continue along this lane for 0.9 of a mile until you see the sign for the School on your right. Turn right into lane and the School is at the end on the left.

## Who are we?

School for Parents Suffolk was established in 2000 and became part of the Dame Vera Lynn Trust in October 2010.

We aim to develop the children's abilities and confidence in the pre-school years to prepare them for life at home and for the next stage in their education.

We put parents at the forefront of their child's learning and development and acknowledge that parents know their child best.

## Who do we help?

Pre-school children with motor and other associated learning difficulties that affect their physical development.

## When?

A weekly session lasting approximately two and a half hours, at present during term time accompanied by a parent or carer.

## What?

A carefully planned programme of activities to suit your child that includes changes of position, movement, body awareness, attention, communication and hand use through play, song and fun.

## Achievable Aims

A session planned for your child to succeed.

Achievable aims are identified in each of the six early learning goal areas:

- Physical development
- Problem solving, reasoning and numeracy
- Knowledge and understanding
- Creative development
- Communication, language and literacy
- Personal, social and emotional development
